Rt. Rev. dear Bishop:

Under the leadership of the Rev. Joseph Reiner, S.J. of Cincinnati, certain Catholic groups of that city are cooperating with the Consumers' League and other organizations in the effort to have enacted at the present session of the Ohio Legislature, a minimum wage law for women and children. Inasmuch as this measure is one of the projects formally approved by the Social Action Department of the National Catholic Welfare Council and advocated in the Bishops' Program of "Social Reconstruction," I am writing to request your approval and, insofar as you think advisable to give it, your cooperation. On the latter point I have no particular suggestion to make, except possibly that a priest of your diocese might be designated by you to represent you in the matter.
