Most of the reference material (non-circulating) in Medieval and Byzantine Studies can be found in the Religious Studies and Philosophy Libraries (designated **T/P** on the call numbers) on the third floor of Mullen Library. Circulating material can be found in the Mullen Library stacks. Check the WRLC catalog: <http://catalog.wrlc.org> for material that could be applicable to your topic. You may want to examine the Library of Congress classification scheme for call numbers if you are browsing: <http://www.loc.gov/catdir/cpsolcco/>. The LC scheme is organized by country or region. Remember, relevant medieval material does exist in other call number ranges (e.g. BX represents Church History in the CUA Libraries collection).

The latest issues of current periodicals are arranged in alphabetical order by title. They are located in the south wing of the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor. ## *Abstracts, Bibliographies and Indices*

### *Abbreviationes (ALADIN)*

*Abbreviationes* is a dictionary of medieval Latin paleography consisting of over 70,000 entries for looking up abbreviations.

### *Bibliographie de Civilization Médiévale (ALADIN)*

*The Bibliographie de civilisation médiévale* (BCM) is a bibliography of monographs and select conference proceedings, essay collections, book reviews, and Festschriften. The BCM covers over 40,000 titles from 1958 and focuses on the Central Middle Ages with coverage to expand eventually to the Early and Late Middle Ages. You may search the

*International Medieval Bibliography* and the BCM as part of the Brepolis Medieval Bibliographies.

***Cahiers de civilisation médiévale (Print)***

Poitiers: Université de Poitiers, Centre d'études supérieures de civilisation médiévale, 1958 - . Do not confuse with the journal of the same name. **T/P CB3 .C13**

***In Principio: Incipit Index of Latin Texts (CD-ROM)***

A searchable index of over 700,000 Latin incipits covering Latin literature from the pre-classical age to the Renaissance.

***International Medieval Bibliography (ALADIN)***

A citation index to the European Middle Ages (400-1500) containing over 300,000 records. Disciplines covered include: Art History, Classics, English Language and Literature, Medieval European Languages and Literatures, History, Archaeology, Theology, Philosophy, Arabic and Islamic Studies, Music, Theatre and Performance Arts, Rhetoric and Communication Studies. No book reviews or monographs. Search *The Bibliographie de civilisation médiévale* and the *IMB* simultaneously.

***Iter (ALADIN)***

A bibliographic database pertaining to the Middle Ages and Renaissance (400-1700); over 1700 journal titles published since 1784 are indexed in such fields as medieval and renaissance studies, philosophy, religious studies, music, literature, and general humanities. Quite a lot of canon law material can be found. Also check *Iter Italicum*, the online version of Paul Oskar Kristeller's work published between 1963 and 1992 that lists uncatalogued or incompletely catalogued Renaissance humanistic manuscripts found in libraries and collections all over the world. Citations to canonical works are given.

***Latin Bibliography (CD-ROM)***

This bibliography contains over 395,00 titles from around 140 countries spanning from the 15<sup>th</sup> century to present day. It lists theological, philosophical and scientific treatises and dissertations, works of European Humanism, official ecclesiastical writings, Latin Bible translations, works of Church patriarchs, literature of the middle Ages and writings of Roman antiquity.

***Medioevo latino: bollettino bibliografico della cultura europea dal secolo VI al XIII. (Print)***

Spoletto : Centro italiano di studi sull'alto Medioevo, 1980- . **T/P CB 1.5 .M4**  
Introduction and notes in Italian. International bibliography. *A cura di Claudio Leonardi e di Rino Avesani, Ferruccio Bertini, Giuseppe Cremascoli, and Giovanni Orlandi.* This series indexes the ongoing scholarly literature dealing with medieval civilization and religion. It covers multiple topics and people. This is an excellent source for finding up-to-date sources as well as those from recent decades.

## *Subject Specific Abstracts, Bibliographies and Indices*

### *ATLA Religion Database with ATLASerials (ALADIN)*

*ATLA Religion Database with ATLASerials* is the premier index to journal articles, book reviews, and collections of essays in all fields of religion. More than 1,500 journals are indexed annually. The database includes more than 1.6 million bibliographic records for journal articles, more than 225,000 essay citations from 18,700 multi-author works, and close to 500,000 book review citations. Coverage begins in 1949 although indexing for some journal titles extends back into the nineteenth century. Links are provided to 238,000 full text articles from more than fifty journals.

### *L'Annee philologique (ALADIN)*

Critical and analytical bibliography of Greek and Roman Antiquity. Late antiquity and early Medieval period would be useful to the medievalist. 1949 - present. Print version from 1924 (T/P PA29 .A61).

### *Catholic Periodical and Literature Index Online (ALADIN)*

*CPLI Online* includes indexed citations to over 400,000 articles published in Roman Catholic periodicals, papal documents, church proclamations and books cover all aspects of the Catholic faith and lifestyle. Coverage begins in 1981 and is continues to the present. Print version is available for 1930 – 2004 and is located in the Religious Studies/Philosophy Library A13 .C3.

### *Index Islamicus (CD-ROM)*

“A bibliography of publications on Islam and the Muslim world from 1906 to 2000. An index to the worldwide literature in European languages on Islam, the Middle East and the Muslim world. Covers all aspects of the life and thought of Muslims past and present, including architecture, art, education, history, law, literature, philosophy, religion, sciences, social sciences, politics, and current affairs, in the Middle East, Muslim areas of Asia and Africa, and Muslim minorities around the world.” The CD-ROM is located in the MERIC Lab (1<sup>st</sup> floor Mullen Library) and the print can be found in the Semitics/ICOR Library (35 Mullen Library, Garden level).

### *Index Philosophicus (CD-ROM)*

A humanities and social sciences database with citations to journal articles, book reviews, and festschriften in philosophy, psychology, theology, religion and other disciplines. Covers 1983 to present citations from IBZ (*Internationale Bibliographie der Zeitschriftenliteratur*), IBR (*Internationale Bibliographie der Rezensionen aus allen Gebieten des Wissens*) and IJBF (*Internationale Jahresbibliography der Festschriften*). European emphasis with only 50% of the citations referencing English material. Print versions of IBZ (AI 9 .B59) and IBR (Z 5051 .I65) are available in the 2nd floor Reading Room. 1983 – present.

### *MLA International Bibliography (ALADIN)*

Subjects covered include: criticism, language, linguistics, literature, film, speech, rhetoric, communication theory, interpersonal communication, drama, and folklore. Coverage begins in 1925 with the indexing of citations from over 7100 journals as well

as series, monographs, dissertations, bibliographies, proceedings and other materials. This resource is the database of choice for all critical scholarship in languages research regardless of scholarly field. The print version (**Ref PB 5.9 .M69 M6**) is in the 1<sup>st</sup> floor reference room and goes back to 1921.

## *General Abstracts, Bibliographies and Indices*

### *Academic Search Premier (ALADIN)*

*Academic Search Premier* is the world's largest scholarly, multi-disciplinary full text database containing full text for nearly 4,600 publications, including more than 3,500 peer-reviewed publications. Some journals index back to 1965.

### *ArticleFirst (ALADIN)*

An index of articles from nearly 16,000 journals across a variety of subjects with over 23 million citation records. One of the main subjects is philosophy. 1990 – present.

### *Humanities International Complete (ALADIN)*

A comprehensive database of humanities content, the HIC indexes and abstracts over 2,100 journals and contains over 2.47 million records. Several hundred (890) journals have full text availability. Coverage goes back as far as 1929. This database includes all data from *American Humanities Index* and *Humanities International Index* (over 1.6 million records).

### *Proquest (Periodical Abstracts) (ALADIN)*

Multi-subject reference source covering general and academic periodicals; full-text is available for many journals. Current news to historical events. 1971 – present.

### *WorldCat (OCLC Catalog)*

OCLC *WorldCat* database is the OCLC online catalog. It contains over 107 million titles and over one billion records describing library holdings. This is an excellent database for acquiring correct bibliographic citations and locating copies of a title in the DC area.

## *Primary Texts*

### *Archive of Celtic-Latin Literature (CD-ROM)*

The corpus of Latin literature produced in Celtic-speaking Europe and the Latin works of the "peregrini" on mainland Europe during the period 400 - 1200 A.D. These texts span a variety of fields including theology, liturgy, grammar, hagiography, poetry, and historiography. Document types include legal texts, charters, and inscriptions.

### *Bibliotheca Teubneriana Latina (CD-ROM)*

Database of over 500 complete works in Latin literature covering the Roman Republic to the Imperial Period and Late Antiquity (300 BCE to 500 AD).

### *Dictionary of Old English Corpus*

*The Dictionary of Old English Corpus* is an online database consisting of 3047 texts of Old English.

### *Dictionary of Old English: A to G online (ALADIN)*

*The Dictionary of Old English: A to G* covers the vocabulary of 600 - 1150 A.D. The DOE complements the Middle English Dictionary which covers 1100 - 1500 A.D. and the Oxford English Dictionary. These three works comprise a comprehensive English vocabulary. Entries in the DOE have links to the OED. The DOE has over 12,000 headwords.

### *Library of Latin Texts (ALADIN)*

This database comprises almost all works published in the *Corpus Christianorum*, both the *Series Latina* and *Continuatio Mediaevalis* (approximately 70% of the database), *Bibliotheca scriptorum Romanorum Teubneriana* and 600,000 words for the modern period. Selected works from the following series are also present: *Corpus Scriptorum Ecclesiasticorum Latinorum*, *Sources Chrétiennes*, *Migne's Patrologia*, *Acta Sanctorum*, *Analecta Hymnica Medii Aevi*. The print version begins with **T/P BQ310. C.67**.

### *Monumenta Germaniae Historica (CD-ROM & Online) (full text)*

The MGH is a collection of several hundred works in German medieval history dating from 500 to 1500 A.D. Contains selections from the five divisions of the *Monumenta Germaniae Historica* (*Scriptores*, *Leges*, *Diplomata*, *Epistolae*, *Antiquitates*), which covers a wide range of medieval documentation. Newer series cover specific studies. The entire collection up to the year 2000, is available in digital form at <http://www.dmgh.de/> For those folks still needing the print version, it is available in Room 316 Mullen in the folios section. ### *Past Masters (CD-ROM)*

We have the works of Augustine (*Opera Omnia-Corpus Augustinianum Gissense*), the collected works of Thomas Aquinas in English, and Anselm's *Opera Omnia*.

### *Patrologia Latina (ALADIN)*

Works of the Church Fathers from Tertullian in 200 AD to Pope Innocent III in 1216. The print version is called 'Patrologiae cursus completus' edited by J.-P. Migne 1844-1865. Two series, 'Series Latina' (221 v.) and 'Series Graeca' (161 v.). The printversion begins with **T/P BQ 310 .M35**.

### *Patrologiae Graecae (ALADIN)*

The PG contains more than 160 volumes of Greek material (with Latin translations) relevant to the study of the history of the Christian Church from its beginnings through the Council of Florence in 1439.

### *Thesaurus Linguae Graecae (ALADIN)*

Contains texts in Greek literature from the eighth century BCE to 600 AD. Also has historiographical, lexicographical, and scholastic texts from the period between 600 and 1453 AD.

### *Thesaurus Linguae Latinae (CD-ROM)*

The TLL is the premier Latin dictionary. Entries included in this edition cover the letter ranges A to P. The print version can be found in the Greek and Latin Seminar Room in the folios section (**G & L PA 2361 .T41**)

### *Thomae Aquinatis Opera Omnia (CD-ROM)*

The entirety of the works of St. Thomas Aquinas in Latin. *Index Thomisticus* is available in the Religious Studies/Philosophy Library folios. **T/P BQ 6879 .B96 folios** . You may want to examine the *Corpus Thomisticum* website as well:
